OVERVIEW: Aligned with Sonoma County Tourism's (SCT) brand of "Life Opens Up" and the "Discover Your &" consumer marketing campaign, our messaging will connect travelers with invitations to explore the destination beyond the typical expectations of a wine and food destination. We will convey the intrinsic benefits Sonoma County offers visitors. Storytelling, which will lead with offerings and experiences, will enforce Sonoma County as a premier wine country destination while also showcasing how the region boasts a wealth of riches that offer "more than" just wine.

KEY BENEFIT STATEMENT: More than just a premier wine country destination, visitors to Sonoma County will discover the best of many worlds through a combination of unique, immersive activities and unexpected experiences.

- Emotional Benefits: Sonoma County's myriad options allow travelers to connect with this destination in ways that support each traveler's personal needs. No matter how you choose to de-compress, how you prefer to explore, or how you like to connect (or disconnect), you can do *more than* you expected during winter in Sonoma County.
- Supporting Messaging:
 - From farm-to-table food and sustainably produced wines to outdoor adventures, wellness experiences, and cultural exploration, Sonoma County is a destination where you'll need more than just two or three days.
 - Enjoy community events that celebrate our rich agricultural roots of early spring like <u>Butter & Eggs Days Parade & Festival</u>, the <u>Apple Blossom Parade & Festival</u>, <u>Passport to Dry Creek Valley</u>, and <u>Earth Day weekend</u>.
 - By enjoying local restaurants, visitors directly contribute to supporting local farmers and ensuring a sustainable and thriving agricultural landscape in Sonoma County.
 - O By showcasing our sustainable farming practices through farm tours, we aim to provide a rich, immersive, and educational experience that connects people with the unique sense of place in Sonoma County.

- Places like <u>Beltane Ranch</u> and <u>NewTree Ranch</u> offer more than just an overnight stay explore their gardens and meet the growers and farmers. Enjoy seed-to-plate.
- Sonoma County Tourism's <u>More Than A Stay</u> promotion entices visitors with incredible offers from lodging, wineries, restaurants, attractions, and more. Stay *More Than* a couple nights to enjoy it all!
- Visits to Sonoma County this time of year allow for a more intimate experience, personalized experiences, unhurried itineraries, and a chance to explore the county's varied cultural, culinary, and outdoor attractions.
- Thanks to our Mediterranean climate, spring days showcase green rolling hills, blue skies, and wildflowers blooming. Warm afternoons lead to cool, crisp evenings that call for s'mores and red wine by a warm fire. A chance to rediscover your natural rhythm and experience a greater level of reconnection with your loved ones, and yourself.
- The season paints the landscape with lush, green beauty, thanks to winter rains, enhancing the charm of the region's rolling vineyards, redwood forests, and coastal areas, often enveloped in mist and fog, creating breathtaking vistas.
- Wine enthusiasts will find the wintertime ideal for quieter, more intimate wine
 tasting, as the tasting rooms are less crowded, allowing for meaningful
 interactions with winemakers and staff. The cooler weather ushers in a cozy
 atmosphere, with wineries offering warm fires and cave tastings, out of the
 elements. Local restaurants feature seasonal, locally grown comfort food, perfect
 for wine and food pairings in a relaxed setting.
- Travelers seeking relaxation will appreciate the opportunity for spa retreats at luxury boutique hotels and spa centers, where they can indulge in spa treatments with local remedies amidst the region's natural beauty.
- Outdoor enthusiasts can relish the milder winter climate for activities such as
 hiking, biking, and exploring the rugged coastline, with regional parks providing
 picturesque trails for <u>birdwatching</u> (Bodega Bay is a hot spot), and nature
 photography.
- Experiences:
 - Cultural experiences where you meet the locals and luminaries like at
 <u>Neighborhood Nights</u> at Glen Ellen Star or a weeklong April gastronomic
 event curated by renowned Sonoma Chef Dustin Valette at <u>Timber Cove</u>
 <u>Lodge</u>.
 - A secret and not a secret; Bodega Bay is well-known for being a bird-watching hotspot. Like whales, birds have a migration route and Bodega Bay sits right on it. Typically, visitors can spot Albatross, Northern Fulmar, a variety of Shearwaters', Petrels, Cormorants, Phalaropes, Jaegers, Gulls, Elegant Tern, Common Murre, Pigeon Guillemot, Cassin's

Auklet, and dozens more. There are birding clubs that offer guided tours or <u>check out spots on your own</u>. Don't forget your binoculars! An experience visitors can arrange through Dawn Ranch.

FOOD and WINE

More than just eating: Renowned wine and food offerings go hand in hand with philanthropy in Sonoma County.

- Supporting Messaging:
 - Sonoma County's early spring season is compelling due to its emphasis on local, seasonal, and farm-to-table cuisine, our rich wine culture, holiday events, and strong community spirit that drives philanthropic efforts to help those in need. This combination of culinary excellence and a commitment to giving back to the community makes the winter and early spring season in Sonoma County a special and heartwarming experience.
 - Sonoma County's thriving food and wine scene offers renowned culinary experiences and an opportunity for visitors to be a part of giving back to those in need.
 - Attending events or enjoying wines at wineries is contributing to support community efforts for those in need.
 - The <u>Purpose</u> line of wines at <u>Eco Terrano Wine and Vineyard</u> directly gives back to area nonprofits, allowing consumers to positively impact the community.
 - <u>Griffo Distillery</u> donates 10% of all profits of their canned cocktails to Climate
 Action. The first donation will go to Sonoma Land Trust. Try their chocolate and spirit tasting.
 - <u>Equality Vines</u> champions the rights of women, migrants and those who identify as LGBTQ+ by donating a percentage of sales to related organizations.
 - <u>Bricoleur Vineyards</u> "Sip with Purpose" campaign donates to the V Foundation for cancer research for each bottle purchased, and for every case purchased the founders of Bricoleur Vineyards will match with a \$60 donation.
 - SingleThread's Kyle and Katina Connaughton share a lifelong passion for skateboarding and in August 2021 became members on the Board of Advocates for <u>The Skatepark Project</u>, a nonprofit established by legendary skateboarding icon Tony Hawk. The Skatepark Project issues grants to low-income communities to build quality public skateparks and provides guidance to city

officials, parents, and children through the process. They have been supporters of Sonoma Family Meals as well.

More than just eating: Sonoma County offers a renowned food and wine scene and is a place where visitors can understand and appreciate where their food comes from.

- Emotional Benefits: Gratitude and appreciation for the food and more importantly the
 people and land that provide it, connection to nature, mindfulness, increased sense of
 curiosity, feeling good about one's decisions to eat local and seasonal, increased cultural
 and community connection. Fun and camaraderie in learning about the local food and
 its growers.
- Luminary Stories Meet our Makers
 The slower pace during the winter and early spring months generally translates to a
 more intimate experience, perfect for those who appreciate hearing the stories behind
 the food and wine, often directly from the makers themselves; the chef, the farmer, the
 winemaker, the brewmaster, or the cheesemaker, all in a cozy, relaxed atmosphere.
- Supporting Messaging:
 - Visitors can understand where their food comes from in fun, playful environments and through elevated experiences.
 - Wintertime usually means more opportunities for visitors to connect with winemakers, winery owners, and cellar masters who love to share their wine making philosophies, and stories about how they got to where they are.
 - Agri-tourism experiences help visitors understand how food is medicine at places like <u>Gold Ridge Organic Farms</u>.
 - With a deep-rooted commitment to stewardship and zero food waste, <u>Single Thread Farms</u> is a diverse 24-acre regenerative garden without machinery or pesticides using succession planting, ensuring a continuous supply of seasonal produce for the ever-changing 11-course tasting menu. Single Thread repurposes everything from root to skin. More than grapes, there are several heirloom crops and a variety of produce grown in Sonoma County. This bounty is part of the renowned local dining scene.
 - Diverse cuisines inspired by diverse backgrounds and cultures, including SingleThread's nod to Japanese cuisine; Chef Stéphane St. Louis's background at Table Culture Provisions, Mamadou Diouf and Cafe Frida Gallery.

• Experiences:

- o Seaweed foraging on the Sonoma Coast in late spring/early summer.
- o Gleaning winter produce with <u>Farm to Pantry.</u>
- <u>U-Pick at Earthseed Farm</u> starting in late April. EARTHseed Farm is a blackowned organic farm and orchard located on the ancestral lands of the Coast Miwok and Southern Pomo Peoples. The farm practices permaculture stewardship, an ecological design system that incorporates Indigenous wisdom to

elevate ecosystem health while meeting human needs. During the U-pick program, visitors can pick their own fruits and berries, and stewards walk them through the farm, educating them on permaculture design while showing off the ripest produce.

WELLBEING

More than just wine & dine: Go beyond (just) wine tasting in Sonoma County with unique experiences like sound immersion, forest bathing, guided yoga, meditation, and more. We add the *being* to wellbeing.

- Emotional Benefits: Relaxation and reduced stress and anxiety; mindfulness; a place to unwind, reflect, rejuvenate, and have fun doing so.
- Sonoma County provides a range of opportunities to support wellness and wellbeing
 during the winter season, from natural hot springs and outdoor activities to wellness
 retreats, cultural events, and educational experiences. These options cater to various
 aspects of physical, mental, and emotional health, making it an appealing destination for
 those seeking a holistic approach to wellness.

- Sonoma County is renowned for its stunning landscapes and world-class wine, but what truly sets it apart is the rich tapestry of diverse cultures that have converged here. The interplay of these cultures creates a vibrant, inclusive, and transformative wellness experiences that incorporate Buddhist, Taoist, Native American practices, from yoga to massages to mindfulness and more, informing our holistic approach to wellness.
