	Sonoma County Tourism Convention Center Talking Points 1. The idea of a convention center arose from the SCT Destination Stewardship and Resiliency			
	Master Plan (launched May 2023). It was the "Big Audacious Goal" within the Strengthen the Health of the Region's Economy imperative. 2. Because of the long development timeline and visibility			

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	of this project, SCT elected to focus on			
	gaining an understanding of the feasibility of this venue			
	immediately following the launch of the			
	plan.			
	3. This project is owned by the SCT Business Development			
	team. Jonny Westom, VP Business			
	Development, is lead and Tanya Rainey, Community			
	Development Manager is the day-to-day.			
	4. SCT identified HVS (HVS Convention, Sports &			
	Entertainment Facilities Consulting) as a viable			
	contractor for the feasibility study portion of the project.			
	HVS has an office in San Francisco and			
	has conducted more than 60 appraisal and feasibility			
	studies in Sonoma County since 2017.			
	5. Because of the public nature of this project, SCT			
	identified members of business and			
	organization groups representing a county-wide constituency to become part of the Convention			
	Center Advisory Council. At least initially, this is an ad hoc			
	group designed to provide insights for			
	HVS on the feasibility study and issues and opportunities			
	inherent to their own organizations.			
	6. The project is in its infancy (10/23). HVS has begun the			
	first of a two-phase study. The first phase			
	is meant to determine whether Sonoma County is a			
	feasible location for a convention center.			
	This is done with four key pieces of data:			
	a. Market research – reviewing Sonoma County's			
	infrastructure, competitive landscape,			
	assets, etc.			
	b. In-market visit – reviewing the potential locations for a			
	center.			
	c. Meeting planner survey – identifying whether meeting			
	planners would be interested in			
	conducting meetings in Sonoma County and if so, what			
	type of facility would be most			

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	d. Discussions with the Advisory Council. We anticipate this first phase being completed before the middle of December. 7. Once the first phase of the study is completed, the results will be analyzed to determine the overall viability of a Center in Sonoma County and potential locations that meet the criteria outlined in the HVS evaluation matrix. 8. SCT will determine the communications strategy based on the results of the first phase. (No external communications at this point.) Meetings with key stakeholders and potentially with organizations, government leaders and agencies associated with the potential locations. This phase will likely extend through the end of the calendar year – TBD. 9. Once SCT, the Advisory Council and Board of Directors feel the time is right, HVS will move to phase two of the feasibility study. This will better identify the scope of the facility. 10. As HVS conducts its Phase two study, SCT will work on a go-forward/communications strategy and determine how to continue the project once phase two is completed.
